Welcome and acknowledgement of Country

Nico welcomed everyone to the meeting. Gab acknowledged the Awabakal people, as the traditional owners of the lands around Lake Macquarie, and paid respects to Aboriginal elders past, present and emerging.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

1. Meeting with Mayor, Wednesday 23 March at 4.30pm

Key meeting objectives (agreed at February board meeting):

- Improving communications and collaboration with Council
- Introduce new Alliance board and current projects to Council

Discussion around:

- Clarifying the agenda aiming to provide agenda and brief background to Council prior to meeting
- What do we expect from Council? What are Council's expectations of us?
- Recognise that we have many objectives in common with Council. How do Council and SN both maximise our efforts and impacts? How do we best collaborate and work together?
- How best to improve Council communication, consultation and community engagement to facilitate better decisions and value community input.
- Suggest circulating 2021 Annual report to attendees prior to meeting to give overview of SN and summary of current projects.

ACTION: Nico to arrange meeting with attendees above to confirm agenda and talking points. Steve to confirm Alliance attendees with Cr Fraser, and seek advice about Councillors and staff who will be attending.

Councillors endorse the Tiny Forest concept. Grant application for Tiny Forest submitted to Hunter Water (thanks for feedback). Currenting waiting on a date to present project to relevant Council staff (with CEO, EarthWatch Aust), and to further discuss proposed site. Steering Committee to be formed in coming weeks.
