1. Alliance AGM date

3. Living Smart Festival

Reports from the festival. What worked well and what didn't? Report engagement numbers, number of new sign ups etc.

Report from Steve – Waste to Art was popular, as were other SNG stalls (but felt to be too scattered).

- Used Boomerang Alliance petition on phasing out takeaway coffee cups.
- Interest in Recycle Mate app

- Interest in CC soft plastic recycling option in general yellow bin and potential idea (will be explored in the future after current contract expires) to explore recycling silicone (can't be done yet).
- Good discussions with key people including McDonald's plans for 3 bin system.
- Sunday worked well more time and closer together.

Gabby

- Very successful nature play busier in the afternoon. Added extra in the afternoon on the Sunday.
- ReLeaf stall overshadowed by Breast Feed Ass awning. Hidden and squashed. Needed more space.

Mark – better advertised.

4. Renewing Sustainable Neighbourhoods

Ten people attended first Sugar Valley meeting (6 new people and 4 existing members). Also planning a shopping centre pop up on 15 October.

Belmont first meeting scheduled for October. First workshop went well with 15 people attending. Thanks Sam and Gab for attending and presenting.

Both groups focussed on developing SNAPs, and establishing governance and group culture.

5. Plastic Free cafes and coffee trucks

\$400 leftover (\$100) – approval to spend on more reusable cup for car boot sale. Approved.

Costco? – look at their plastic use. UberEat/Menulog – waste generated.

6. Repair Café

Final report for grant submitted.

Upcoming event dates incl Cameron Park, Sat 3 December -confirmed at The Canopy. Need volunteers.

22 Oct WBT. Need volunteers.

Developing next years calendar. Rathmines keen to look at next year and potentially Toronto.

Brainstorming session to occur to streamline processes. Hosting nationwide session to support one another.

7. ReLeaf

Tree trial – meeting to be held 1st Nov. Robyn off to State Library this month. Opening November 12.

Report from LSF – launched online raffle (just) in time for LSF. Proceeds to Tiny Forest/future greening efforts – setting up the raffle was a real challenge.

\$240 in online sales of tickets at festival, \$120 in cash and 1 garden consult booked - \$50.

Felt signage produced for the Festival was too small and not reusable due to not being backed.

Interesting conversations had with multiple community members at the 2-day event including Jodie Harrison and John Atkins (TAFE) about tree canopy coverage in Lake Mac.

\$10,000 Origin Energy.

Robyn has LSF posters printed A3 and laminated for future events.

8. Rathmines Planting project

Rathmines – plan to plant on Sunday or next Sunday if needed. 30-40 plants in the 35m range.

9. Tiny forest

Tiny Forest Update—received \$10,000 sponsorship from Origin Energy. Draft concept design has been produced and required plant species are currently being ordered through TIN and Landcare for planned planting in March/April 2023.

Applications submitted for Council Sponsorship funds.

10. Waste free Christmas workshops

Cardiff run workshops ahead of Xmas. Potential train the trainer. Seek advice from Cardiff on experience/ideas. Social media posts – Rachelle.
