MINUTES

1. Welcome and acknowledgement of Country

Gab welcomed everyone to the meeting. Gab acknowledged the Awabakal people as the Traditional Owners of the land that we are meeting on, and that sovereignty has never been ceded.

Gab reminded the meeting of board member roles and responsibilities, particularly in relation to representing the interests of the Sustainable Neighbourhood network.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

2. Strategic Plan Review - Report back from board members

Noted action from previous meeting for board members to nominate actions they would like to pursue for each Strategic Plan (visibility, financial, volunteer support, impact).

Discussion ideas:

- Importance and benefits of citywide projects as a way for SN groups to work together, and increase participation more generally.
- Strategic Planning / Review workshop:
 - o Seek participation from at least Chair and Secretary from each SN group.
 - o Provide ideas and input into plan
 - Board to develop workshop agenda
 - o Professional facilitator
- Also opportunity to share and learn from each other.
 Eg style and content of local group newsletters varies markedly. Would be good to share ideas and lessons about what works and doesn't.
 Opportunity for more detail in citywide newsletter.

3. Community notice boards (Bruce)

Idea to offer community noticeboards to local SN groups. A common design and size with solar ability to light up after dark. Each SN group entitled to one or more. Location TBC. Sponsored by the local SN group with the aim to engage in partnership with a local organisation or group. Ie...Lions, Rotary etc

Note that locations and use of Council land would likely be difficult to secure. Private land (eg shopping centres or schools) may be an alternate option.

Mackenzie noted his position in Lions as a potential conflict of interest. Mackenzie will update details in the Alliance's conflict of interest register.

ACTION: Bruce to investigate further to see if groups are interested.

4. Support for Landcare Volunteers (Steve)

Proposal: Many of our SNGs have Landcare as a major focus of their group. It is important that these Landcare volunteers are supported in their work by Council as they are the backbone of Lakemac City's sustainable and environmental efforts. We need to protect their safety and mental health. The Alliance Board views with concern the delay over 12 months in resolving the dispute between the LRO and Warners Bay Landcare. The Alliance Board calls on the LRO and Head of Sustainability Andrew Bryant to quickly resolve the problems so volunteers, as soon as possible, can get back to plant to shore up creek embankments and prepare for National Tree Day in July. To be sent to Jason Harvey and Andrew Bryant.

RESOLUTION: The board discussed the issue at length and resolved not to take any action.

5. SN stall at Council's Electric Vehicle Day

Council is planning an Electric Vehicle open day at the Administration Centre at Speers Point on Saturday 13 May, 10am-2.30pm. It's going to be a busy day, with community members able to see a variety of EVs, ride along in EVs, talk to EV owners, attend talks, learn about chargers and enjoy a day out.

Sustainable Neighbourhoods are invited to have a stall there, focussing on energy projects, and sign ups to the SN newsletter. Seeking if there's any interest to have a stall?

Steve and Gayle have expressed their interest.

6. Council's Operational Plan + Fees and Charges on exhibition

Council's draft Operational Plan and budget 2023-2024 outlines the actions and projects Council will undertake to achieve the strategies in the revised Delivery Program 2022-2026 and objectives defined in the Lake Macquarie City Community Strategic Plan 2017-2027.

Note the exhibition includes the draft <u>Fees and Charges 2023-2024</u>, which sets out hire fees for the new Landcare and Sustainable Living Centre

7. Letter to McDonald's Australia (Steve)

Draft letter circulated asking McDonald's to install recycling bins and commence a public education campaign to encourage recycling of their packaging.

Rachelle noted that the reference to Council should be removed, and that it should use the full name of the Alliance, the Lake Macquarie Sustainable Neighbourhood Alliance.

Agreement to go ahead and sent the letter with those changes.

The license agreement has now been signed and submitted to Council progressing towards permission to work on that piece of land. Final approval is expected hopefully by the end of this week.

Still a number of landscaping details to be confirmed because of delays in communications and land approval, including edging to protect the site from vehicles; site boundary pegging, sourcing suitable specific plants, signage and unexpected cost increases. Volunteers who might like to help with these organisational aspects are welcome.

13. Styles Point – progress on OzFish project

Council currently working to prepare the site. Aiming for planting in May.

Have a great volunteer team on board, and have started planning for an October exhibition + possible other events.

17. Solar Sense event

Valentine Area SNG is organising an event for 11 June to help residents understand solar power options, and hear from other locals who have gone through the process. They have been in touch with Redhead to learn from their EnergyWave project.

18. EnergyWave final report

Redhead SNG has completed their grant paperwork, including the results of their project, and valuable survey results, demonstrating the impact of their project.

Note an increase in people seeking assistance through the Pamper Care project from 11 people in March 2022 to 26 people in March 2023 – a 65% increase.

Pamper Care has been able to supply a freezer to the Woodrising Neighbourhood Centre, and has helped secure a \$6000 grant from the NSW government for ongoing support for the program.
