3. National Volunteer Week + Go Circular film screening

Successful evening, with 45 attendees, and great feedback about the film. Thanks to Warners Bay Area SNG and Munibung Hill Conservation Society and Council.

5. Volunteer Survey



Survey report is almost complete! Rachelle will distribute to board members for review before distributing more broadly.

6. Tiny Forest

Tiny Forest planting days have been very successful. 51 year 3-6 students, 5 staff members and 4 volunteers from Teralba Public School planted an initial 167 trees, followed by a sold-out community planting day where 71 community members sowed another 510 plants. Saturday June 3rd, our Tree Keeper team (made up of 18 community volunteers and a local service club, who will care for and maintain the site for the first two years) added the final 70 native species.

Discussion about investment vs benefits of Tiny Forest approach. Noted importance of support for more 'traditional' greening projects eg expanding and accelerating Cardiff Area SNG's Spare a Square project, and other greening projects on public and private land.

Promotion and education outcomes have been great for Tiny Forest, and we can do this for other greening projects as well, without a significant monetary cost. Also potential to deliver citizen science activities at other greening sites, and deliver education programs. Project suggestion for ReLeaf. Note Earthwatch Citizen Science protocols being implemented for the Tiny Forest that will provide a measure of success over first 2 years. Can these be used for other sites as well?

ACTION: Jean to prepare ReLeaf proposal for next board meeting about potential for citizen science program to compare / evaluate success at range of SN greening sites.
