3 Guest Speaker – Wes Hain, LMCC

Wes requested to attend the meeting to give board members an update on Council's 'Shape Your Future' activities.

- Council has been engaging across all avenues to encourage input from as many residents and stakeholders as possible.
- Future forums are coming up in September encourage Sustainable Neighbourhood volunteers to attend. Forum details are on the website.
- Expect the 'Vision, Values and Strategic Direction' component to be completed by end 2016. A Community Strategic Plan will be completed by mid 2017, and an Integrated Landuse Strategy by end 2018.

- Results of the vision and values so far include the lake, access (services, facilities, town centres etc), amenity (bushland, beaches, open space), and active lifestyle.

8 For discussion & decision

8.1 Living Smart Festival and Plastic Bag Campaign

• Feedback from Plastic Bag Free NSW

- Last August, they presented 12,000 of the petitions to NSW state parliament.
- They have received our 600 hard copy petitions.
- They are still collecting the petitions, but are currently reviewing their strategy in this regard, as there has been a number of new developments (container deposit scheme etc)
- They are meeting Thursday 18 Aug, and will let me know the outcomes of what they plan to do next.
- Ocean Action Pod and OCCI displays at Living Smart Fest
 - Currently seeking funding to have the Ocean Action Pod attend and be set up next to the Alliance and OCCI displays. The pod will work in very well with SN messages, and also with Council's Eco Angel program.

• WWDSNG waste display

- The West Wallsend District SNG has offered their waste display boards to use at the Living Smart Festival. Photos of the displays were circulated via email. These will work in well with the existing plans for the displays, and the pod above etc.
- Steve also has some displays of eg non-plastic coffee cups and reusable 'yoghurt' pouches etc and examples of recyclables that we can use as a display on the day.
- Plastic Bag Champions
 - Additional Champion businesses from Toronto have been added to the website. Seeking more contact and website details for them.

• Media release

- Steve has drafted and circulated a media release, and some subsequent edits from Rachelle and Colin.
- Suggest development of subsequent media releases to target different media outlets.

8.2 Results of Alliance Board Quiz

Review tasks are underway. So far:

- Alliance Board 'self assessment' quiz completed.
- Volunteer survey developed and distributed, 37 completed so far.
- Currently setting up staff and Board Member attendance at local SNG meetings.
- Rachelle and Colin attended Valentine's August meeting.
- Participant survey developed, and tested at Cardiff Car Boot Sale.
- Stakeholder survey in development.

Jess presented the results of the Alliance Board 'self assessment' quiz. These were also circulated to board members via email. The results highlighted a high level of consistency amongst board members for many of the questions, and some functions areas that could be prioritised for improvement.

Jess will now be in touch with board members to conduct interviews. We expect that the interviews will be useful to draw out further details about board members' experiences and identify opportunities for improvement.

8.3 AGM date and Network Celebration

Seeking ideas and feedback about this year's AGM, and networking event. We need to have our AGM some time in November, and it's well time to hold a networking / celebration event as well. There have been some great projects over the last 12 months, eg Old Waste New Art, Nature Play project, Plant Swap, Illegal Dumping project, Reusable bag workshop, Tossers can be Binners stage 2, Car Boot Sale, Wangi Centenary etc etc that would be good to share amongst the network and wider community.

- Hold AGM as part of our normal November board meeting, Tuesday 15 November
- Hold a networking / celebration event on a weekend in October / November, to showcase our projects as above, and as a volunteer thank you / end of year celebration etc. Previously we've been to the Belmont Neighbourhood Centre, and to Landcare (Teralba). Some ideas??
 - Might be nice to hold in conjunction with the OWNA exhibition in West Wallsend, Saturday 8 October. Would need to see what the West Wallsend SNG think of the idea, and whether there's a suitable place and time we could get together without negatively impacting on their event.
 - Or Plastic free Pot luck lunch / afternoon tea in a park somewhere (with alternate venue for rainy back up)
 - o Show and tell at the art gallery, and picnic by the lake?
 - Any other ideas?

- The Canon Community Environmental Grant Application has been submitted.
- The petition has reached 723 signatures.
- Greg piper talks about Awaba SCA and illegal dumping in his July newsletter.
- Negotiations between Centennial Coal and Crown Lands are still on the table in regards to the illegal dumping issue and land ownership.

- Centennial Coal to put cement blocks adjacent to gates at Freeman's Drive because people are being irresponsible.
- Spokesperson for the Awaba project went out with LMCC staff to view LMCC owned land in Awaba Conservation Area.
