#### 1 For discussion & decision

#### 1.1 Hunter Water Consultative Forum

Norbert circulated and email invitation from Declan Clausen on behalf of the Hunter Water Consultative Forum.

The Forum is seeking additional community representatives – particularly from Lake Macquarie. The Forum "provides advice on the interests of customers and consumers of Hunter Water, the Customer Contract and other key issues related to Hunter Water's planning and operations as Hunter Water may determine.

Colin and Avril have experience in participating in the forum in the past and noted that the role involves significant effort to digest and communicate the data received.

The forum may be relevant to our Sustainable Neighbourhood members in terms of Hunter Water's activities in Lake Macquarie.

No decision was made, but the item will be added to the agenda for next the ordinary meeting of the Alliance.

Avril also mentioned her role representing the CEN on Council's Estuary and Coastal Management Committee, and suggested that it might be suitable for the Alliance to have a representative on this committee.

# **Guest Presentation from Alec Roberts, CLEANaS**

Alec gave a presentation detailing the activities of CLEANaS (Clean Energy Association of Newcastle and Surrounds). They are a not-for-profit association who aim to drive the uptake of clean energy in the Newcastle region.

They support community groups to establish community owned solar installations which generate clean energy for direct use by local businesses, by:

- developing an effective community energy financing mechanism
- undertaking community engagement
- · identifying appropriate project sites.

Alec also outlined a number of their projects including:

- 48 community funded solar panels now installed at the Hunter Wetlands
- And possible future / pending projects with:
  - Hunter Surf Life Saving Clubs with club buildings between Catherine Hill Bay and Birubi Beach
  - Margaret Jurd Learning Centre
  - o Compass Housing

CLEANaS has some funds for project management and otherwise run by volunteers.
