Expression of interest submitted to Pat Conroy's office, 13 August 2015. The EOI will be considered by a Committee (for the Charlton electorate) in September. If successful, the group will be notified by 23 Sept, and will need to submit a detailed grant application by 2 October. Given that Rachelle will be on leave, the fast turnaround time, and that the Alliance Board have reviewed a similar grant application for the same project, we would like to enable the WASNG to submit this application without immediate review by board members.

## 8.6 Grant Expression of Interest: 'Pit Pony Park Rehabilitation Project' – Greater

**Charlestown SNG** – Submitted to the Stronger Communities Program (Shortland) (Aust Government Dept of Infrastructure and Regional Development.)

The Greater Charlestown SNG have submitted an expression of interest (EOI) to Jill Hall's Office for 'stage 2' of the Pit Pony Park project. Assume that there will be a tight timeframe if the EOI is successful.

The Alliance will not be able to provide insurance for the activities mentioned in the EOI, including tree planting and use of an excavator. Concerns were also raised about reports of tree planting that have already taken place in the park without Council's permission.

However, if Council were willing and able to provide insurance, oversight and appropriate permissions for the project, then the Alliance would be willing to utilise our incorporation status to enable the GCSNG to receive grant funds.

MOTION: Dependent on approval by Council for the project, the Alliance agree to auspice the grant application, but cannot provide insurance or oversight for the activities detailed in the EOI.

## 9 Report backs from member groups

## 9.1 Sustainable Neighbourhood gathering at Toronto Fire Station, 22 August.

~20 people attended. Informative afternoon. Participants enjoyed being shown around the garden, and hearing about projects from Redhead, Valentine and Wangi Area.

#### 9.2 Bunnings Sausage Sizzle, fundraiser, West Wallsend District SNG, 29 August

Their feedback included that they were under-supplied and had to purchase more food on several occasions. They also missed one esky of sausages, so ended up buying more than needed. Would be good to organise that better in future.

Turnover \$1911; Preliminary estimate of profit is ~\$1300.

## 9.3 Awabakal Nature Play Day, Dudley SNG, 5 September

Went really well. Had over 80 participants and split them up into groups. Follow up story sent to media. Project still includes some improvements to the eco sleuth trail at the Awabakal EEC, and they are looking at running a spotlighting event in ~ March or April.

## 9.4 Toronto Area – Tossers can be binners stage 2 – Fast food rubbish

GlubGrant application was actually successful (they just forgot to tell the group). Steve is looking at focussing on fast food outlets in Toronto, to install anti-littering signage. They are looking at holding an event in Marc 2016.

**9.5 Health and Safety Training** – held Wednesday 2 September.

7 participants. 5 from SN groups and 2 from community gardens.

#### 9.6 Community Safety Plan Workshop for Dora Creek residents, held in August

Would be good to hold another one out of hours for working people to attend.

- **9.7 ANZAC murals** Have been meaning to seal the murals with anti-graffitti sealant, but it keeps raining! Research booklets are currently being drafted.
- **9.8 Redhead storm meeting** Response received from Council regarding road flooding, and suggestion for more strategic placement of road closure signs. Suggestions will be passed on to the local emergency management committee.
- **9.9 Redhead Dog Lovers Day** Noted that the Redhead SNG are not involved in organising the day that has been organised for October. The event organisers and Council will be formally notified of this.
- **9.10 Eco Health Expo** Grant acquittals pending.
- **9.11 Walk to School Survey** The Greater Charlestown SNG are undertaking surveys with local schools to identify infrastructure gaps / dangerous crossings or intersections etc.

#### 10.1 Smart future smart cites conference

31Sept -3 Oct. The conference organisers are looking for volunteers. Possibility of having a stall there, if the SN network provides some volunteers to help with the conference itself.

#### 10.3 Susan's resignation

Susan Denholm formally resigned from her position as a Board Member. Has been a great opportunity, but other commitments need to take priority for now and in the foreseeable future. Board members thanked Susan for her assistance and significant contribution to the Alliance Board – particularly in helping to get the organisation and fundamental processes established.
