The Cooranbong Sustainable Neighbourhood Group, BETTER Cooranbong (Bringing Everyone Together To Empower Residents), consists of community members that live and work in the Cooranbong neighbourhood area. We are passionate about working with our fellow neighbours to make Cooranbong more sustainable and enhance our community.

We embrace the principles of democracy, inclusiveness, good governance, sound planning and sharing our skills and knowledge. New members are always welcome.

BETTER Cooranbong developed this plan to inspire, empower, and lead our community to a more sustainable future. It contains a range of community driven projects and actions that our community is passionate about and will strive to accomplish.

The Sustainable Neighbourhood Program

Lake Macquarie City Council is committed to caring for the local environment and making a fair contribution to a sustainable planet. The Sustainable Neighbourhood Program is a bottom up approach which enables communities to develop their own neighbourhood sustainability action plan, implement actions that reduce their neighbourhood footprint, and increase their neighbourhoods overall wellbeing.

Growing a Sustainable Cooranbong – a methodology

In 2009, Council worked with representatives from the Cooranbong Community Services Centre, Cooranbong Chamber of Commerce and Avondale College to develop a Sustainable Neighbourhood Group in Cooranbong. Since then, BETTER Cooranbong has embarked on a range of activities to engage with our neighbours to deepen our understanding of Cooranbong, and discover the passions of Cooranbong residents and the aspirations they have for their community.

Over 200 Cooranbong residents have directly contributed their values, ideas, and energy into developing this plan by participating in a range of activities such as community workshops, information stalls, a community survey, and regular group meetings.

The actions in the plan have been prioritised according to community enthusiasm and their potential to reduce our individual and collective ecological footprint, and increase our neighbourhood's wellbeing.

This plan is a living document, belonging to the Cooranbong community. It will improve and grow as decided by the Cooranbong community, in light of changing knowledge and experience. BETTER Cooranbong, is committed to implementing this plan, and to monitoring and reviewing it annually.

Our Vision for a Sustainable Cooranbong

To preserve and improve the quality of life for Cooranbong residents and their natural environment


We want Cooranbong to be a place where:

- Everyone minimises their use of resources and has a smaller than average ecological footprint, by integrating sustainability into their everyday actions
- All residents are valued and strong community connections are forged to empower residents and improve community wellbeing; and
- Opportunities for our residents to attain skills, abilities, and knowledge are provided, enabling us to take action to achieve our vision.

Cooranbong - Our Community

Our neighbourhood includes approximately 2,983 people in 1,012 households. Selected statistics from the 2006 Census are shown below

The Census data indicates that the Cooranbong community has a very high proportion of residents who volunteer. It also highlights that a significant proportion of our population do not currently have family responsibilities. This combination of social circumstances will increase opportunities for our neighbourhood to work together to achieve goals.

The Census data also highlight that our neighbourhood includes a number of residents who may be at risk of social isolation and disconnection from our community. Many people in Cooranbong are older and need assistance with self-care, and therefore may be isolated from community life and social activities. These groups may have difficulty coping with natural disasters, responding to change, and participating in community life. Over the next ten years, our community will need to embrace these demographic groups to ensure they can participate and engage with community life. Integrating the actions set out in this plan with the wide range of existing services and networks in Cooranbong will help reach these residents.

Our Attitudes to Sustainability

The Community Attitudes Survey highlighted that the Cooranbong community are committed to reducing their ecological footprint, with a majority (>90%) owning a compost bin. Most households (>70%) also have water efficient appliances and fittings; home insulation; and energy efficient appliances. Respondents ranked 'saving money' as the most important motivator to improve their environmental behaviour, closely followed by 'a personal responsibility to do the right thing for the environment'. The most important issues raised by Cooranbong residents included urban development and urban expansion; air pollution; and the need for relevant infrastructure. The ongoing management of waste was also rated as important.

Cooranbong Neighbourhood Values

Value 1: 'We care for our community'

Residents of Cooranbong value their peaceful and friendly community. It is a place of natural beauty, with a strong sense of community spirit. Cooranbong residents are prepared to work together to strengthen community ties and maintain a friendly happy community.

Together we will...

- Strengthen community ties by creating opportunities for inclusion of all residents in community activities;
- Take part in civic life and public decision making, particularly on matters that affect our neighbourhood; and
- Support local business and tradespeople, welcome new neighbours and visitors, look out for our older residents and the children of our neighbourhood.

Value 2: 'We love our Environment'

Cooranbong is a place of diverse natural beauty. The neighbourhood contains four of the nine ecosystem types that exist in Lake Macquarie City, including Forest, Woodland, Wetland and Waterways. There are four endangered ecological communities in the Cooranbong Sustainable Neighbourhood area, including Freshwater Wetlands on Coastal Floodplains, Riverflat Eucalyptus Forest on the Coastal Floodplain, Swamp Oak Floodplain Forest and Swamp Sclerophyll Forest on the Coastal Floodplain.

Cooranbong residents appreciate their surrounding environment and are taking steps to maintain and enhance the ecosystems in their neighbourhood.

Together we will...

- Understand the environmental challenges that may affect our neighbourhood now and in the future; and
- Maintain and enhance our natural assets.

Value 3: 'We are committed to reducing our footprint'

The majority of Cooranbong residents agree that the actions of the average person have a large impact on slowing climate change. Keeping this in mind, we are working towards reducing our ecological footprint and living sustainably. As a community, we can adopt lifestyles that enable us to meet our present needs and maintain a healthy environment for future generations.

Together we will...

- Take personal action to make our households more sustainable with respect to reduced energy, water, and fuel usage, reduced amounts of chemicals used in homes, reduced consumption and generation of waste;
- Become better informed on aspects of sustainable living including green energy, water and waste management, and passive urban design;
- Apply eco-friendly gardening principles to enhance the amenity of our properties; and
- Work together to create a sustainable community.

Value 4: 'We want to be prepared for natural disasters'

The term 'natural disaster' covers a range of effects from natural hazards including bushfires, flooding, drought, severe storms, earthquakes, tsunamis etc. Cooranbong residents have an appropriate level of concern regarding natural disasters, particularly bushfires and severe storms. Residents are committed to preparing for and understanding the risks to their community.

Together we will...

- Understand the risks to our community.
- Learn what we can do as individuals and a community to prepare for natural disasters.
