For residents and friends of Morisset, Balcolyn, Bonnells Bay, Brightwaters, Mirrabooka, Morisset Park, Silverwater, Sunshine, Windermere Park and Yarrawonga Park

Lake Macquarie City residents have a strong commitment to their environment and community. In response, Lake Macquarie City Council has established the Sustainable Neighbourhoods Program. The program encourages active citizenship by enabling residents to:

- protect and care for their environment and place;
- reduce resource consumption;
- respond effectively to environmental threats; and
- · participate in public life and decision-making.

This plan contains a vision for the Morisset and Peninsula neighbourhood and was developed to inspire, empower and lead our community to a more sustainable future. Around 260 local residents have contributed to the development of this plan.

This plan documents the features that residents and friends of the wider Morisset and Peninsula area love and value about their community and want to protect or enhance. It also identifies opportunities for change and outlines potential areas for a variety of local community-led projects.



Our residents value:

- our lifestyle that combines country living and peace and quiet with access to a range of facilities, services, and opportunities;
- the affable people that foster community spirit and our connections with friends and family;
- our natural environment, which includes bushland, wildlife, proximity to the lake, mountains and open space; and
- our outdoor lifestyle and opportunities for recreation.

Did you know:

- Our neighbourhood contains important wildlife corridors connecting
 wetland and bushland areas, as well as providing refuge for a range of
 important local flora and fauna such as the Common Sugar Glider and
 the threatened plant *Tetratheca juncea*.
- The Morisset and Peninsula area has on average, an older population than other areas of NSW.
- Early industries of the area included fishing and timber cutting. Timber
 was historically taken to the sawmills at Morisset or by water to other
 towns around Lake Macquarie.
- 'Mere' is an Old English word meaning lake. During the 1924 subdivision, Windermere Park Estate was given its name, honouring the largest lake in England.
- Our neighbourhood has many culturally and environmentally sensitive places including the Koompahtoo Aboriginal area, which is a unique bushland area.
- The Norfolk Island pines at Shingle Splitters Point, Balcolyn are a landmark today and are thought to have been planted by early settler Alfred Sara in 1920.
- Morisset is an important town centre providing services for residents from Toronto to Wyee and beyond.
