
Kenew Lambton Colliery Buildings at Rechead Recherd Sustainable Neighbourhood

What we achieved


Based on the submissions provided by the group, Lake Macquarie Council was given a grant of \$145,000 to refurbish the site!

Together the group was able to:

- Preserve a historical site
- Sustainably reuse an existing building
- Create partnerships between State Government, Local Government and residents

How did we do it?

The group made several submissions to the NSW State Government, asking for the site to be refurbished and preserved. The group also met with Lake Macquarie Council representatives, making connections between residents, community groups and government.
