Results from Dudley Workshop 1

1 - A vision of a Sustainable Dudley

Participants imagined what a sustainable Dudley could look like.

Below is a 'word cloud' depicting the words participants used to create their vision. The bigger the word, the more often it was used.



Responses focussed around 5 key areas:

- Pedestrian and cycle friendly, including public transport and the Fernleigh Track
- The idea of a 'Village Green' a meeting place and community hub, linked with a community garden, markets, possible recycling centre, cafes, playground, and more street trees
- Protecting natural environments including Landcare, Coastcare, bush regeneration, enforcement, stormwater management, and bushfire management
- A community garden ideally integrated with the village green / community hub ideas
- Sustainable households using solar and other technologies to produce energy, waste reduction

2 - Dudley's Strengths and Assets

Participants brainstormed the personal skills, community assets, groups, physical assets etc that might help us achieve our vision for a Sustainable Dudley.



Connecting our assets and vision

- Community hall and surrounds as 'Village Green'. Could include space for Community garden, recycling, market day
- War memorial wall at entrance to village → opportunity for a community mural?
- People with a wide range of expertise, experience, knowledge and skills to assist with projects (eg planning, grant applications, advocacy)
- Existing (old rail) link to Fernleigh Track → opportunity for relatively easy connection to Dudley
- School community connections
- Range of community gardens in region to model / gardeners to consult
- · Win with local bus service example of community success
