Clean up Australia day report

We had 52 volunteers turn up ready to work and they picked up 51 bags or rubbish including 8 bags of recyclables. We picked up about 1/2 tonne of various debris including two TVs and a car door. Pedestrian Safety on Beach Road, Redhead.

Since our community meeting Lake Macquarie City Council have had two site inspections and have come back to the Redhead Community with four proposals to attempt to improve pedestrian safety along Redhead Road. The **Redhead Foreshore Action** Committee favours the Webb Park entry option at Allard St (1b) with the provision for a footbridge (2a)

as it allows for access to both the park and the beach. It also takes pedestrians out of harm's way, avoiding the intersection between Beach Rd and the car park entry. While this is unfortunately a longer term proposal we feel it will likely result in the best long term outcome. Funding of all four proposals remains an issue in both the short and long term.

Police Advice to Protect Our Property

Our village of Redhead is generally a very safe and secure neighbourhood, however over the last few months there has been a recent spate of attempted breakins and property thefts. They have been reported to the police, but are still a bit of a worry.

In response, local residents Tim Madison and Matt Unwin organised a meeting of about 30 neighbourhood friends with Belmont police on 24 April in the park at the end of Beach Road. The discussion was about what we could do to reverse this apparently growing trend in Redhead.

Tim handed out a community notice and spoke about the need to be vigilant. "We need to make sure that we lock the house, the

car and the garage, that we don't leave garage remotes or spare keys in cars, and we keep keys, wallets and phones in a safe place at home" he said, "and make sure outside sensor lights work and let your neighbour know when you are going away."

He drew a probable connection between the hoon activity around the Beach Road carpark and the apparent increase in criminal activity. "They get away with it there and they think Redhead is an easy target".

Police District Inspector Kylie Phillips strongly supported Tim's suggestions and assured the group that the police were responding to the situation. Investigations were under way and there are now more police patrols in Redhead.

Police Crime Prevention Officer, SC Sharm Whitehead said that policing is a partnership with the community and the police rely on us to report anti-social and suspicious activity. "All reports go into a database which highlights hotspots for police attention. I encourage you to report crime, by contacting Belmont Police or Crime-stoppers. Your reporting will enable police to schedule patrol numbers and times of day or night to get the best results"

she said. "But if you witness a crime being committed, call **000** and we will respond immediately." Talking about car theft, Sharm added: "Since 2003 all cars have been fitted with immobilisers, and car thieves need your keys to steal your car. So keep your car keys secure!"

Redhead Community Library Reopens After Refurbishment

You may have noticed the activity and temporary fencing around the Community Library in 16 Hutchinson St next to the Anglican Church. This building has been staffed by volunteers from the local community under an agreement with Council since the restructure of Lake Macquarie Libraries in 1985. Council funds a yearly grant for new books. It was threatened again with closure again in 2011 but strong Community opposition kept it open. Council renamed it Redhead Community Library Facility.

It operates still as a library
Thursday & Friday 3-5pm and
Saturday morning 10-12. It's also
available for hire through the
Library Committee chaired by
Maggie Lavercombe. Eastlakes
U3a conducts classes for seniors in
painting and drawing, creative
writing, guitar and china painting
at the facility.

Come in and check out the renovations which include disabled parking, a bike rack and a wide ramp easily accessible for

wheelchairs and prams. A Justice of the Peace (JP) is available on the 1st Saturday of the month. The Library belongs to our Community.

Council's greener 3-bin service will launch from 30 July. Food will now going into your green bin along with garden waste, and will be emptied each week. One week your green and garbage bins will be collected, and the next week your green and recycling bins will be collected. Before the service changes, a Starter Kit will be delivered to all homes in the City and will include:

- a food scraps bin for your kitchen
- compostable bags
- new green bin stickers
- an information pack, including a 'when to put your bins out' calendar
