

Extension of Fernleigh Track

Cyclists and walkers are celebrating, with a new section of the Fernleigh Track to go ahead passing through picturesque Belmont Wetlands. The NSW government will chip in \$7.4 million and Lake Macquarie Council will fund the rest of the \$12 million project. It will run from the Belmont end of the Fernleigh Track to an existing shared pathway at Blacksmiths, creating a 27 km continuous cycleway from Murrays Beach to Adamstown.



The NSW grant comes from the \$300 million Regional Growth - Environmental & Tourism Fund, set up to deliver infrastructure projects that improve the economic growth of the State.

The Fernleigh Awabakal Shared Pathway (FAST) includes an elevated boardwalk past Belmont Wetlands that will feature local indigenous art. The Council is taking feedback from the community on portal https://shape.lakemac.com.au/fast. Feedback closes 3 April 2020.

Clean Up Australia was held in Redhead on Sunday 1 March. We were pleased with the support we received



Weeds - Turkey Rhubarb

Turkey Rhubarb is another invasive weed, found mostly



along the coast in moist gullies and dunes. It is a low growing plant, with long scrambling, climbing stems, triangular, pointy leaves and cream flowers. The stems can be as long as 5 metres. The plant has a larger tuber which needs to e removed and it can produce chains of underground tubers. These can take considerable digging to remove. The Turkey Rhubarb will regenerate from the tubers if only the top growth is removed. The plants produce thousands of

papery seeds, with three wings. They germinate under native vegetation and smother the supporting plant. This weed should be removed as soon as it shows up in your garden.



Cain Street Landcare Group

The long, dry summer has ended with much needed rain, and for our Landcare site between Cain Street and the lagoon, a lot of

new growth is springing up. Many native plants are beginning to recover but unfortunately so too are the weeds and unwanted invasive plants. We made a good start last year and are looking forward to being more strategic in our approach for 2020. Our Landcare group is committed to restoring the natural bush environment so that our indigenous plants and wildlife can thrive as well as creating pleasant spaces for us all to enjoy. Restorations of the Dunes

Council has undertaken dune rehabilitation works at Redhead Beach. The works include the installation of a dune protection timber and wire fence at the northern and southern dunes at First Creek, Redhead. These works are for the protection and enhancement of Redhead's sand dunes and the restoration of sand dune vegetation. Sadly, after the fences were installed 4WD drivers have already ventured into the dunes in this area, and crashed into some of the posts.

When visiting our beaches please remember to stay off dunes, avoid trampling dune vegetation and keep out of fenced areas.

Sharks and Conditions Monitoring at Redhead Beach

Lots of great news from Redhead Surf Life Saving Club and Lake Macquarie City Council in regards to keeping our beaches safe.

An array of cameras and sensors has been installed at Redhead and Blacksmiths Beaches. The technology will be trialled throughout the 2019-20 beach season. Sensors and other smart infrastructure will monitor wave and swell movement to provide earlier detection of dangerous conditions, while others will monitor visitor activity to gauge which beaches and amenities, parking, outdoor showers, are busiest at any given time. A trial special metal tower has also been erected to



provide shark alerts. The remote alerts can be transmitted to a mobile in real-time to a lifeguard, so especially useful overnight and in winter, when there are no Life Guards on duty. The shark detection drone trial is also still active mainly at

busy times and on weekends.

A \$20,000 artwork will also be installed at Redhead Beach as part of Council's Smart Beaches project. Expressions of interest have opened for the commission, calling for artists to take inspiration from the picturesque coastal setting, themed on beach conditions or beach safety. Submissions would be judged on their originality, quality, relevance and ability to articulate these core concepts.

What's happening at Whiddon Redhead?

In October 2019 Stage one of the development was completed and Whiddon Residential Care Facility Redhead opened a brand new two-storey home offering 80 single rooms with sea views, a café, health spaces, a hair salon, activities spaces, 8 small household-living areas and on-site Community Care. The new two-storey building has been designed to incorporate small household living areas that look and feel more like home. They are each centred around an interactive kitchen, lounge room and intimate dining space.



The expansion and refurbishment of the original home also commenced last year and once completed, it will include a Whiddon Clubhouse, bowling green, relaxing outdoor

spaces and a new dementia specific unit. The project is expected to be fully completed before mid-2020. There is a need for additional residential aged care places for older people in the area. The project will deliver an additional 115 places bringing the total number of residential places offered at Whiddon Redhead to 175. The development also brings new jobs in nursing, care, hospitality and hotel services, and a significant investment in our local community. During the construction phase Whiddon has had a construction, noise and vibration management plan in place and implemented a traffic management plan. Let us know if you have any feedback.

Empowering Homes - solar battery offer

The NSW Government will help homeowners in Redhead access interest-free loans to install solar battery systems. Eligible households can get an interest-free loan:

- \$14,000 towards a solar PV and battery system (repayable over a range of terms up to 8 years), or
- \$9000 towards retrofitting a battery system to an existing solar PV system (repayable over a range of terms up to 10 years).

Break and enter: 11 incidents
Malicious damage: 23 incidents
Stealing: 35 Incidents and 12 vehicles

December 2019 was our busiest month. It is mildly reassuring that Redhead continues to be classified as a "low crime" area, but if you were a victim of any of the incidents above, it is obviously devastating and as a community we would like to prevent such crimes and make Redhead safer.

With car theft, since 2003 all cars have been fitted with imobilisers, and car thieves need your keys in order to steal your car. So we all need to keep our car keys secure! Stealing from motor vehicles is also a common crime, so suggest locking your cars.
