Angie Bainbridge Carries On Redhead Olympic Tradition

Congratulations Angie Bainbridge on her Olympic silver medal in the 4x200m freestyle relay. Redhead can now claim to have a dual Olympic medal winner in Angie who grew up in Redhead and went to Redhead

School. Angie comes from an impressive family of athletes. Her sister Lindsay has also represented Australia in rowing and her brother Wes has represented Australia in surfing. As was the case four years ago in China, when she won gold, Angie did not get to accept her medal on the podium. It was presented in a special ceremony, in front of her teammates, by former Australian gold medallists Kieren Perkins and Chris Fydler. (photo)

She counts competing at the 2008 Beijing Olympics and winning gold as a 17-year-old heat swimmer in the 4x200m freestyle relay as her other career highlight.

Angie won her first individual medal at an international meet at the Barcelona Mare Nostrum Series in 2011, winning gold in the 200m freestyle. She secured a spot on the Olympic Team for the second time after coming sixth in the 200m freestyle at the 2012 National Championships in Adelaide

Angie joins a select group of Olympic athletes who grew up in Redhead including Ian Chapman who started our Olympic tradition and competed as a cyclist in the 1960 Rome Olympics, Michelle Andrews, now Michelle Mitchell who won gold at Atlanta in 1996 as a member of the Hockeyroos,

our all conquering Australian womens' hockey team, and Peter Scott who competed in the kayaking events at Atlanta in 1996 and in Sydney in 2000.

Helen Clare will act as the facilitator for the forum. Also attending will be representatives from Council. Community Forum Continued.. LMCC has completed restoration works on the Winder House and on Saturday 18 August, advertised for proposals for reuse of the buildings. Council will soon be assessing the reuse proposals and the forum is an opportunity for us to have some say about the types of uses we would prefer.

The last Redhead community forum was held at the Bowling Club in 2010 when a number of issues/needs were identified, and resulted in the Redhead Sustainable Neighbourhood Action Plan - 10 local projects aimed at making Redhead more sustainable. They included a community garden, starting a men's shed, Webb Park improvements, bushland improvements, power and water saving and a newsletter to name a few. Redhead people have been working on these projects for over a year now and we need your feedback on how you think they are going.

Redhead Community Garden News

Last newsletter included the news that the Redhead Community Garden was to be established within the grounds of Redhead School. We can now report that work on building the Community Garden is well underway! Working bees are held on the last Sunday of each month from 1pm. The first four working bees held so far have been lots of fun, with people of all ages coming together to create this beautiful space. It's been wonderful to see the garden taking shape.

Integral to the Community of Gardens Project is the educational component. We will be developing a program with guest speakers, dynamic displays, signage and workshops in the community garden. We anticipate that Redhead's Community of Gardens Project will be a model for other groups, schools and organisations to adopt and implement.

We'll have a break at 3pm for some well-earned afternoon tea (bring a plate!) and a "mini-meeting" – a chance for the coordinators to answer questions and for a quick debrief! Redhead Community Library News



Mary Kathleen (Mollie) Haynes 1929-2012

From the time Mollie Haynes first visited Redhead in a horse and sulky for a picnic and determined to settle here, she was a force in the community. She died on 29 July 2012. Mollie, a long time resident and noted artist, was a member of the Redhead Progress Association, a member of the View Club, and President of the University of the Third Age (U3A). She was involved with campaigns for closure and cleanup of the Redhead landfill and against closure of the library, later becoming Chairperson of the Redhead Community Library. She was also a foundation member of the Friends of Lambton Colliery where restoration was completed just before she died. (article page 1) Redhead has lost a committed and active citizen and she will be long and fondly remembered.
