Background

Lake Macquarie City Council established the Sustainable Neighbourhood Program in 2008 to empower residents to act on local environmental and sustainability issues.

The program supports residents to form neighbourhood groups that develop and implement their individual Sustainable Neighbourhood Action Plans. The program has grown into a network of active, skilled and supported citizens who make a meaningful contribution to local community life and address local sustainability challenges.

In 2011, a group of Sustainable Neighbourhood volunteers established the Lake Macquarie Sustainable Neighbourhood Alliance to support the growing number of members and groups across the city. The Alliance is an incorporated not-for-profit association that provides coordination, governance, resourcing, capacity-building, marketing and communication, and insurance and risk management for and on behalf of the Sustainable Neighbourhood groups across Lake Macquarie City.

Sustainable Neighbourhood activities are organised by volunteers and financed through funding from grants, collaboration and community fundraising. Council continues to provide direct support for the program, including provision of administrative services and a small amount of operational support.

A message from the Chair

I was honoured to step into the Chair's role this year and witness the energy, commitment and creativity of our board members and local Sustainable Neighbourhood volunteers.

Though the challenges of COVID-19 remain, our members continue to be connected with each other and their communities. This year, the Alliance board welcomed Anna Noon and Mackenzie Robson. We have already benefitted from their fresh ideas, advocacy and project involvement.

The Alliance board has been focused on delivering priority actions in the Sustainable Neighbourhoods Strategic Plan, including:

- developing closer ties with Council
- strengthening links with local Sustainable Neighbourhood groups
- commencing the Business Supporters program
- renewing the Belmont Area and Sugar Valley Sustainable Neighbourhood groups
- refining and expanding our citywide projects and collaborations
- increasing our visibility through social media and media promotions
- · contributing submissions to Council and other strategies and plans.

A number of Sustainable Neighbourhood projects have made considerable progress this year.

- The ReLeaf Lake Mac team is developing the Tree Trail at the Museum of Art and Culture, yapang. Community greening projects at Blackalls Park and Rathmines are now underway, and substantial planning for the Tiny Forest project is proceeding.
- Our volunteers planted trees at eight locations for National Tree Day and took part in Clean Up Australia.
- Reduce, reuse and waste reduction messages were emphasised at five Repair Cafe sessions, through the Plastic Free Cafes project, a worm farm workshop and three Waste to Art exhibitions.

We have been pleased to influence the development of Council's Urban Greening Strategy, circular economy initiatives, and continue to actively support other key measures to improve the liveability of the city and manage climate change. We continue to collaborate with a range of generous community partners and other groups to strengthen and share our messages.

On behalf of the Alliance board, I give sincere thanks to all of our amazing volunteers and supporters who deliver sustainable living campaigns and projects to communities across the city with great energy and enthusiasm.

Our people

Our volunteers are community leaders, contributing their time and expertise to improve their neighbourhood, care for their place and bring people together. Sustainable Neighbourhood volunteers are passionate about environmental issues, community participation and practical action.

As of June 2022, there are 173 Alliance members and 4782 subscribers to our major enewsletters.

In the 2021-2022 financial year, we estimate our volunteers contributed more than 4600 hours, equivalent to a contribution of more than \$160,000, or a replacement cost value of more than \$204,000. The economic impact of Sustainable Neighbourhood activities is estimated at \$1.28 million.


